If there is a perceived or actual conflict of interest, such as you being related to a SNS worker, we will refer you to another agency.

Strategies to Promote Access and Equity and Reduce Barriers

- Listening to your needs and requests about access and equity, and trying to accommodate these wherever possible
- Making sure you understand your rights and responsibilities when using our service
- Keeping all of our services free of charge
- Delivering services in a culturally appropriate and accessible way
- Arranging access to an interpreter if you need one
- Making sure people using wheelchairs, prams and assistive technology can get around our building and use all of our services
- Putting important information in child-friendly or picture formats so that children can understand them
- Giving you the option of staying anonymous if you are concerned about privacy
- Trying not to keep a waiting list so that you can see us quickly
- Being available for drop-in appointments if something is urgent
- Getting back to you as soon as we can, or assisting you straight away if possible
- Offering outreach and home visits for people who live very far away or don't have transport
- Supporting you to get to appointments with other organisations if you don't have transport
- Helping you deal with other organisations so that their forms and requirements feel less confusing
- Ensuring that we consult with diverse community groups during our planning processes
- Training our staff in working with people from different cultural backgrounds, LGBTQI communities, and people who have disabilitilies or mental health issues
- Referring to you by your preferred name and chosen pronouns
- Asking you for your feedback and opinions
- Asking children for their feedback and opinions
